Home Learning

How would we like you to support your child at home?

Our focus for home learning this year will be on **reading**, **spelling** and **times tables** practice. Each week your child will be given a new book mark which should be kept in their reading book. This book mark will show how many times your child has read at home, their weekly spelling score and the focus for their times table or mental maths practice. **Your child must bring their reading book and bookmark to school everyday.**

Reading

All children are expected to read to an adult at least 3 times a week. An adult should record on their child's bookmark that they have heard their child. Children will receive dojo's or rewards from their class teachers for successfully reading to an adult 3 times per week.

When hearing your child read it is important to encourage your child to talk about what they are reading. In school we use the following principles:

Predict - encourage your child to make predication about what the book/ story will be about. The title or images could be used to support their ideas. Where children have already stated a text, they should use what has happened already, to predict what might happen next.

Read - read for IO to 15 minutes.

Clarify - as they are reading it is important that children understand the vocabulary they come across. Ask your child what unfamiliar words mean and discuss the meaning of the words with them. Older children should be encouraged to find out what unknown words mean.

Question - Ask your child questions about what they have read, talking about characters, settings, plots or in the case of a non-fiction text, what they have found out.

Summarise - Encourage your child to summarise what they have read. What characters have they met? What has happened so far? What do they know?

Even if your child is a fluent reader, it is vital that they are still pushing themselves with challenging texts that introduce them to new and ambitious vocabulary. The link below has some suggested reads for each year group that you might like to use as a guide if you buy your child books or visit the library. We also have many of these books in our school library and classrooms.

Spelling

Each week your child will be given a set of spellings to learn based on a spelling rule or pattern that they have been taught in school. Children will have a week to learn these before being assessed on them in school. These same spellings will also be set on our online platform EdShed, where pupils can login and practice. Times Tables - Year 2 upwards

Instant recall of times table facts up to 12×12 is a valuable skill and a national curriculum requirement. Each year group will focus on a set of times table facts and the focus will be shared with you on your child's bookmark. We ask that your child regularly practices their times tables throughout the week (at least 3 times a week but the more often the better). This could be done in a number of ways.
